**Virtual** PurpleOne, Safe Journey's free domestic violence awareness training, is now virtual.

The agency recently held its first online training via Zoom. More than 30 people took part in the training, which educates individuals on how to recognize and respond to domestic violence, refer victims to Safe Journey's free and confidential services, and how to safely be a prosocial bystander.

Since launching in February 2019, more than 330 people have been trained at 10 sessions. About 60 locations are now certified as safe places, where victims of domestic violence can obtain information about Safe Journey's services.

"We're always looking for new ways to reach out to victims and educate the public," Safe Journey Executive Director Lori Palisin said. "The pandemic opened the door for us to expand our technology, and we're happy with the results." To register for a PurpleOne training or to access the Safe Place Finder, visit PurpleOne.org.

## COVID AND ITS EFFECT ON DOMESTIC VIOLENCE The pandemic

is keeping many vulnerable victims of domestic violence isolated at home. That's a problem for those who live with violent abusers.

Corry City Police report answering a greater number of domestic violence calls, the Erie County Office of Children and Youth report more severe cases of abuse, and hospitals are treating more domestic violence victims.

Victims of domestic violence and their children need our help and support during this pandemic.

Safe Journey has expanded its services to include online counseling, online support groups, and a chat feature. The new technology provides convenient options for victims who may be uncomfortable with in-person counseling due to the pandemic or for any other reason. Online support groups are another welcome addition.

Counselor advocates are available to chat Mon.-Fri. from 8 a.m.-8 p.m. Every effort has been made to ensure online communication between victims and counselor advocates are safe and confidential.

Online counseling adds another layer to the agency's core services that still include possible shelter, individual and group counseling for children and adults, a 24/7 hotline, and telephone counseling.
